



#43954 **1997-2013 Seat Conversion Kit to** fit **1968-1982 Corvettes**

The CA Seat Conversion Kit #43954 makes it possible to install 1997 through 2013 (C5/C6) Corvette seats in a classic 1968 through 1982 (C3) Corvette utilizing the original seat tracks and mounting points. The seats are not included as part of this kit and must be acquired separately. **NOTE**: The power features built into the C5/C6 seats will not be functional after the installation of this conversion kit. **NOTE**: Due to the C5/C6 seat bottom height difference from the C3 seat, head height clearance will be affected.

- 6. Flat Head Screwdriver

- 8. Wire Cutters
- 9. Hog Ring Pliers
- 10. Hog Rings


Removing C3 Seats from the Car

- 1. Locate and remove the four mounting seat bolts (two bolts in front and two bolts in rear) that secure the passenger side seat tracks to the floor using a 1/2" socket/ratchet. See figures 1 and 2.
- Remove the seat from the car by folding the seat forward.
 NOTE: Removing the t-tops, hard top or lowering the convertible top may help with seat removal.
- 3. Repeat the previous steps for the other seat.

Removing the Seat Tracks from C3 Seats

- 1. Locate and remove the 4 mounting bolts that secure the seat tracks to the seat frame using a 3/8" socket/ratchet.
 - NOTE: The bolts are located in between the seat tracks.
- 2. Set the seat tracks aside for later install.
- 3. Repeat the previous steps for the other seat.



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Removing the Seat Tracks from C5/C6 Seats

- 1. On one of the C5/C6 seats, remove seat back adjustment handle by removing the C-Clip with a screwdriver.
- 2. Remove the two Phillips head screws securing the Control Bezel & unplugging the wiring harness once the bezel is loose.
- 3. Locate and remove the hog rings that hold the rear seat cover flap to the support. Also locate and remove the hog rings at the hinge area.
- 4. Untile the drawstring that tightens the seat cover and remove the seat cover and cushion from the frame.
- 5. Locate and remove the four mounting nuts from the original C5/C6 seat tracks using a 1/2" socket/ratchet. See figure 3.
- 6. Remove the wiring controls and disconnect or cut the air lines for the lumbar support. Remove the seat frame from the track assembly.
- 7. Repeat the previous steps for the other seat.

Installing the Seat Conversion Bracket



Note: The notch in the Seat Bracket should always be positioned over the seat track with adjuster handle. See figure 4.

- 1. Attach the bracket to your C5/C6 seat frame by inserting the 5/16"-18 x 1-1/4" bolts up through the inner holes in the seat bracket, place a 1/2" spacer over each bolt, then insert the bolts into the mounting holes on the seat frame. Secure the bolts with the supplied 5/16"-18 Nyloc nuts. Torque nuts to 180 in-lbs. See figure 5A.
- 2. Next bolt the C3 seat tracks to the seat bracket by inserting the 5/16"-18 x 7/8" bolts through the seat tracks. Put a 1/4" spacer over each bolt and then through seat bracket. With a 1/2" socket and wrench secure the bolts using the supplied 5/16"-18 Nyloc nuts. Torque nuts to 180 in-lbs. Figure 5B.
- 3. To reinstall seat cover, reverse the steps in previous section.
- 4. Repeat the previous steps for the other seat.

Installing C5/C6 Seats Into the Car

- To mount the driver seat back in the car align the four mounting holes and reinstall the front and rear seat mounting bolts. Torque bolts to 180 in-lbs.
- 2. Repeat the previous steps for the passenger side seat.
